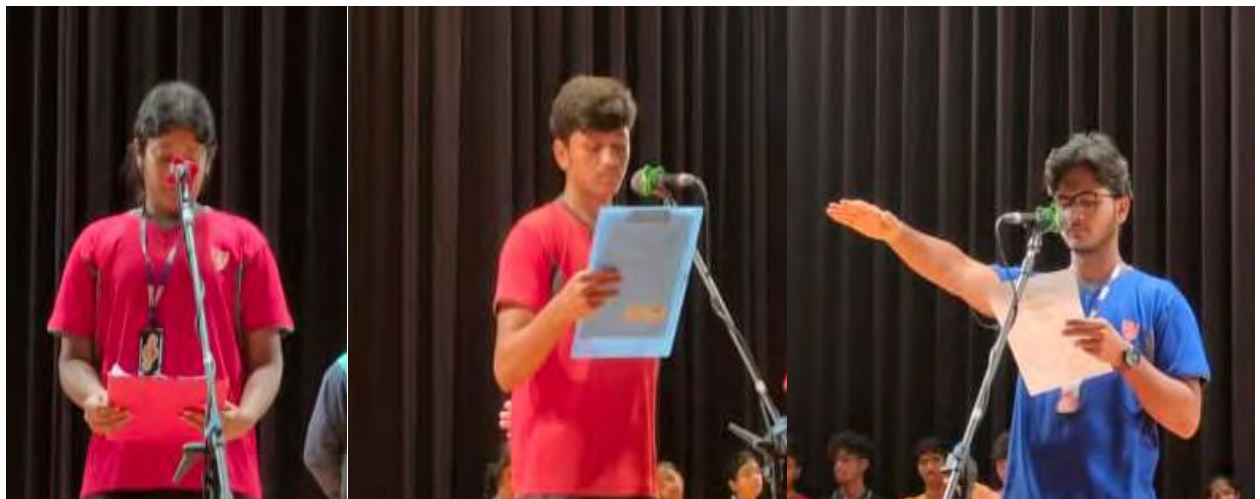

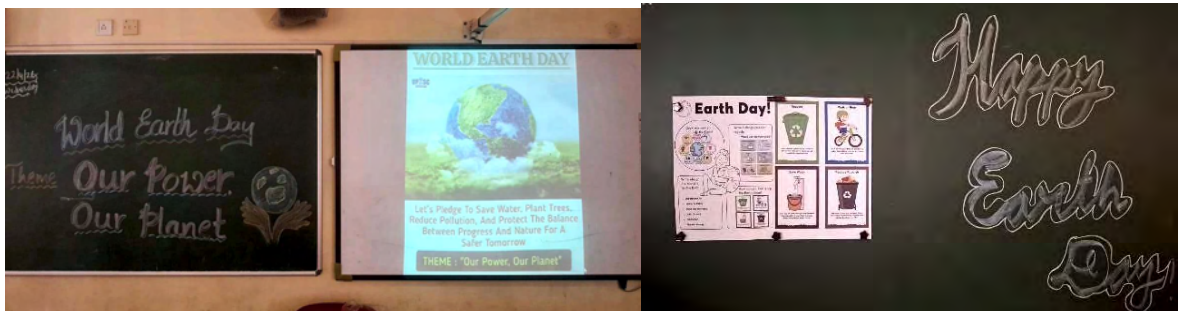


22.04.2026: WORLD EARTH DAY

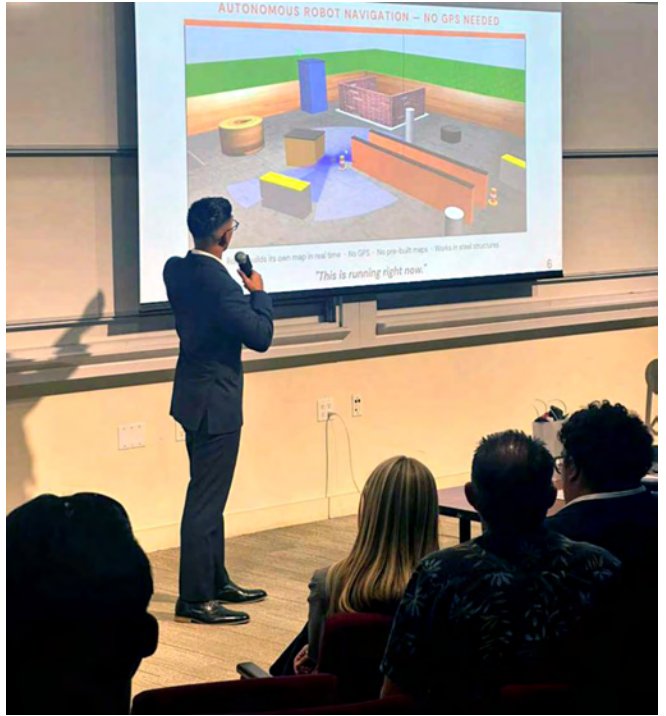
