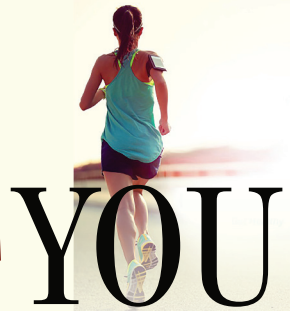

Funtastic Friday – 8.4.22

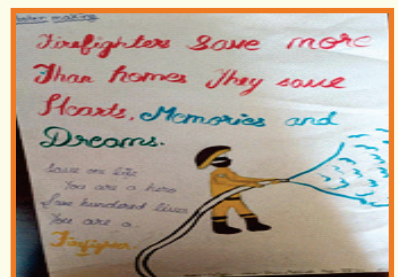
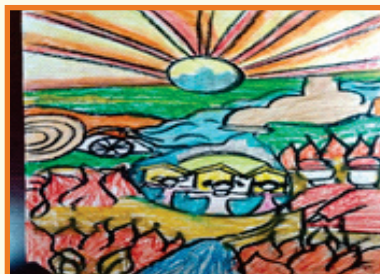
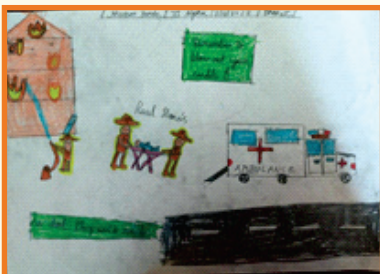

13.4.22 –Workshop on Good & Bad Touch

On 12.4.22 a special assembly was held for the primary students on the topic Good & Bad Touch. An activity was conducted wherein the children were given a circle named MY SAFE CIRCLE and they had to write the names of those whom they considered safe being with.

This assembly served as a forerunner to the workshop conducted on the same topic on 13.4.22 with the objective of spreading awareness and educating children about good and bad touch. Grades 3 to 5 attended the workshop. It is a growing concern among parents and teachers about the safety of their children. Every child needs to be taught that their body belongs to them and they have a right to protect it. With this in mind, the faculty of grades 3 to 5 presented a basic awareness programme on this theme for the children. The workshop began with showing the children an animated video to teach them how to identify the “No Touch” areas, understand who are “Safe Adults” and how to clearly communicate with parents about any bad experience. This was followed by a PPT presentation helping the children understand the difference between good and bad touch. With this gathering, the children will now be able to distinguish and defend themselves against dangers. The goal is to inform without causing anxiety. They were also given instructions on how should one react or respond in an uncomfortable situation. This workshop will surely make our young Reqelforders future ready.

Assembly -20.4.22

In order to celebrate the unique features of our country, the Bhasha Sangam initiative under the "Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat" ushered in a programme for schools and educational institutions to provide multilingual exposure to students in Indian languages listed in Schedule VIII of the Constitution of India. In line with this, we at Reqelford organised an Assembly on 20.4.22. The anchors, students of 6B led the event in 3 different languages ie. : Shloka : TAMIL , Beulah : KANNADA, Tanishka- TELUGU.
