## 06.08.2025: 'CYBER BULLYING AWARENESS SESSION' BY TELANGANA STATE CYBER SECURITY BUREAU

Regelford International School hosted a Cyber bullying Awareness Session on 6<sup>th</sup> August. To raise awareness about the growing issue of cyber bullying and to educate students on how to stay safe online, Telangana State Cyber Security Bureau conducted the session which was attended by students from Grades IX – XII (CBSE & Cambridge)

The main objectives of the session were to:

- Educate students on what cyberbullying is and how it differs from traditional bullying.
- Highlight the emotional, psychological, and legal consequences of cyber bullying.
- Empower students to take responsible actions online and stand against digital harassment.
- Provide practical strategies for preventing and responding to cyber bullying.

The session began with a short video presentation that illustrated real-life scenarios of cyber bullying and its impact on victims. This was followed by an interactive talk by the Resource Person Telangana State Cyber Security Bureau, a guest speaker, counselor, cyber expert, who spoke about the importance of digital etiquette, the concept of a "digital footprint," and how students can report abuse on various platforms.

The session concluded with a pledge taken by all students to use the internet responsibly, respect others online, and report any form of cyber bullying they witness.

The awareness session proved to be insightful and informative. It helped students understand the seriousness of cyber bullying and the importance of maintaining a respectful and safe online environment. ## TOPIC: USE OF ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE IN CLASSROOMS

On 23 August 2025, Reqelford International School hosted an enriching **CBSE Capacity Building Programme** presented by Mr. Perukulambil Ravikanth (Principal, Lyceum School) and Mr. Thirupathi Vennum (Principal, Telangana Tribal Welfare Residential School). The focus was on harnessing Artificial Intelligence (AI) to enhance education in meaningful and ethical ways.

### Key Insights from the Session

#### 1. Transformative Role of AI in Education

AI is revolutionizing the classroom: it can personalize learning experiences, automate time-consuming administrative work, offer intelligent tutoring, increase student engagement, and help detect learning gaps early.

#### 2. Main Themes Discussed

- Personalized Learning Pathways
- Intelligent Tutoring Systems
- Automation of Administrative Tasks
- Enhanced Engagement & Interaction
- Early Detection of Learning Challenges

#### 3. Benefits

- Tailored instruction matched to each student's pace and style to boost understanding and confidence
- More efficient use of teacher time through automated tasks, freeing them to focus on deeper teaching
- Earlier intervention for students who may be struggling, enabling support before issues grow

#### 4. Challenges and Ethical Considerations

- Data privacy and security concerns regarding sensitive student information
- Bias in algorithms which must be carefully monitored and corrected
- Risk of over-dependence on technology; AI should assist, not replace, the human element in teaching
- Ensuring equitable access to AI tools — schools need adequate infrastructure and teacher training

When integrated thoughtfully, with ethical safeguards and strong teacher involvement, AI can empower both students and educators, paving the way toward a more inclusive, effective, and future-ready education system.

# Harvard Model United Nations India — 15th Edition

## (August 14 18, 2025)

The 2025 HMUN India was a landmark event: celebrating 15 years of convening young leaders, thinkers, and change-makers from across the globe. This year's edition was especially memorable for its dynamic committees, intense debates, unexpected crises, and deep learning. The event took place over five days, with delegates fully engaged in research, diplomacy, and international collaboration.

### Committees & Delegation Highlights

- Our delegates were divided among several distinguished committees:
  - WCW (World Council for Women)** — Sridevi Karri
  - UNOOSA (Outer Space Agency)** — Sphoorthi, Jonathan David
  - DISEC (Arms Proliferation)** — Lakshyagna, Tapasya
  - UNEP (Environment)** — Suzanna
  - UNFPA (Population Fund)** — Alpana
  - A Special Ad-Hoc / Surprise Committee** — headed by Rohan Arun as Head Delegate
- Each committee brought its own complex agenda, demanding not just factual research but strategic thinking, alliance building, and the ability to articulate policy solutions that balanced idealism with practicality.

### AdHoc & Role-Play Intensity

- The Ad Hoc / Surprise committee challenged delegates with unpredictable crisis scenarios that required fast thinking and adaptability.
- In one roleplay, representing Lyssia, I argued that an empire's greatest legacy lies more in culture and narrative than in its military might or territorial boundaries — a perspective that redirected the flow of debate, showing how soft power and identity truly sustain influence over time.

### Skills & Growth

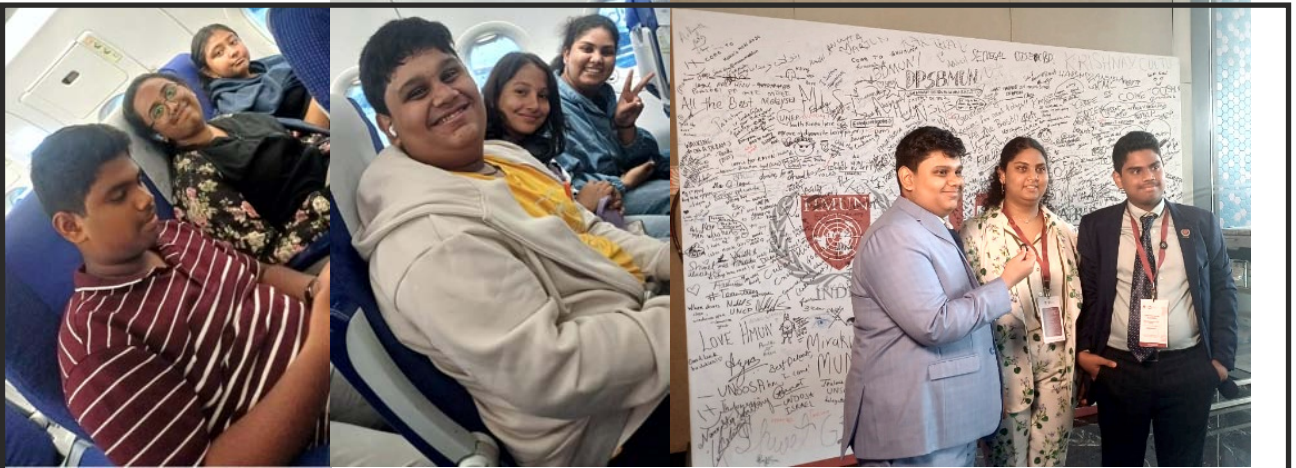
- Beyond public speaking, the experience demanded *listening*, *negotiating*, *improvising* under pressure, and *collaborative problem-solving*.
- Drafting resolution papers with fellow delegates required both compromise and clarity — ensuring that the document reflected shared vision, not just individual preferences.
- Leading a bloc (similar to BRICS, ASEAN) taught strategic leadership: coordinating with others, aligning diverse viewpoints, and persuading both allies and skeptics.

### Atmosphere & Takeaways

- Despite fierce competition, the spirit remained collegial. The energy in committee halls was electrifying: every session brought fresh challenges, and every delegate pushed themselves to be sharper, more persuasive, more thoughtful.
- Outside formal sessions, there were moments that grounded us—mall visits, casual conversations, friendships across nationalities—that reminded everyone this is also about connection, empathy, and global citizenship.

### Overall Reflection

HMUN 2025 was more than a conference; it was a formative journey. It showed me that diplomacy isn't merely talking; it's imagining better futures, adapting when things go off-script, and standing by your convictions while listening to others. Walking out of HMUN, I carried not just my role as Lyssia, or the knowledge of the agendas, but a heightened confidence — in myself, in what teams can achieve, and in the power of debate to transform ideas into action.

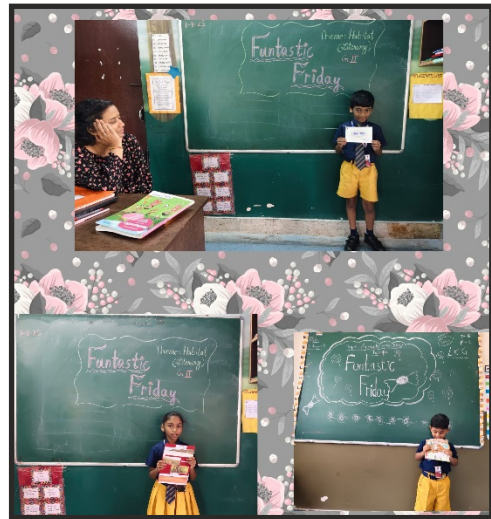

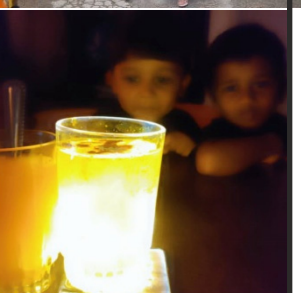
