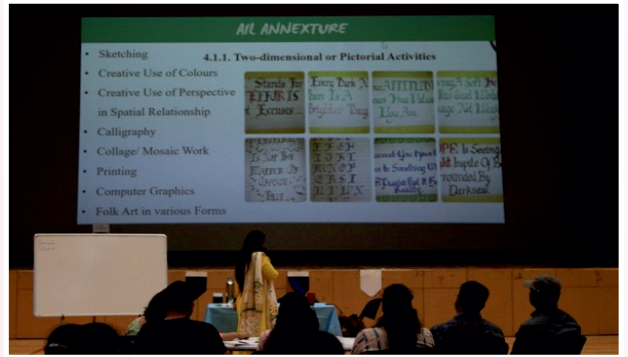




# TEACHERS' WORKSHOP 29<sup>TH</sup> AND 30<sup>TH</sup> MAY : CAPACITY BUILDING

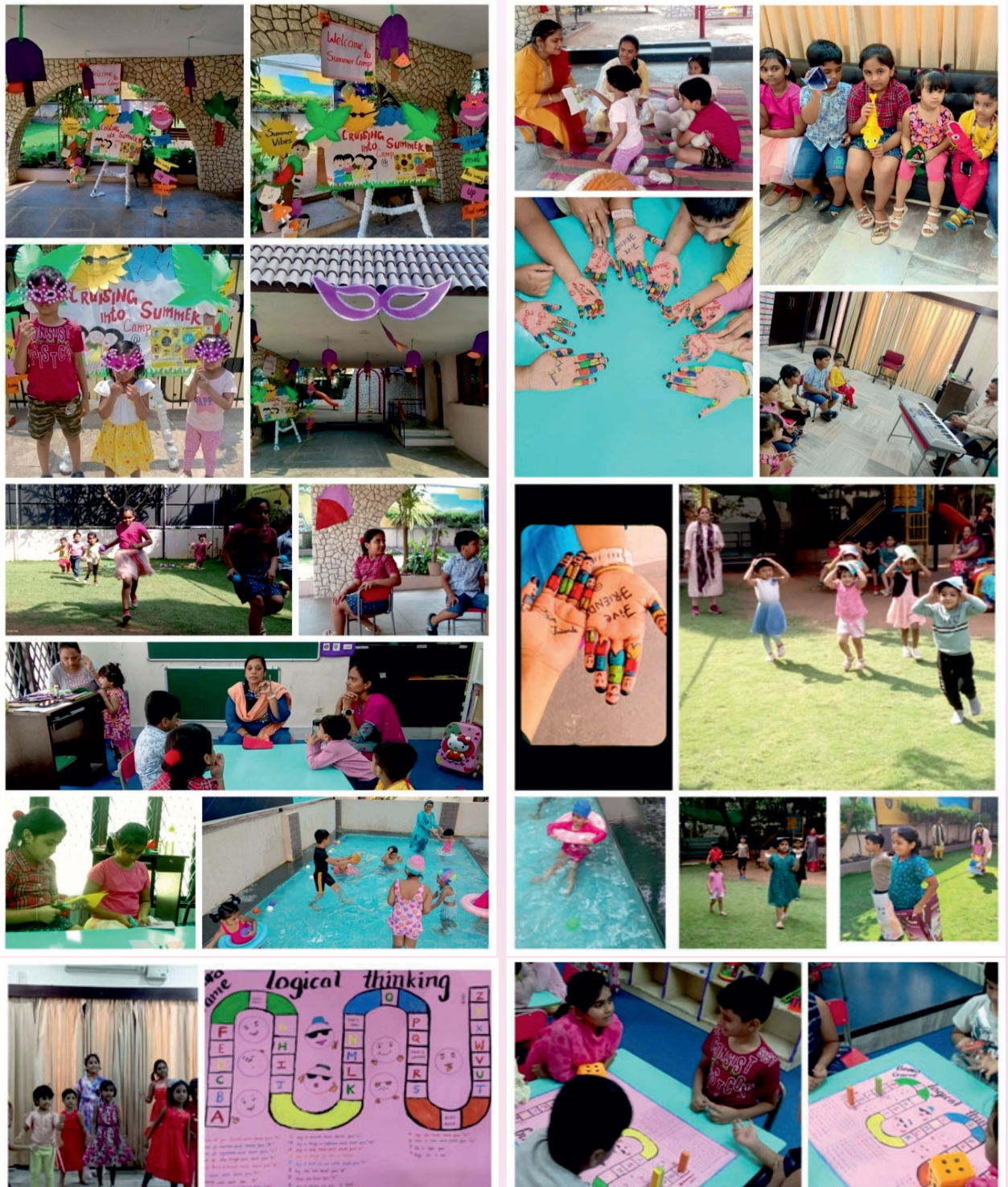


# PLAY SCHOOL : HABSIGUDA

## HAVE FUN !

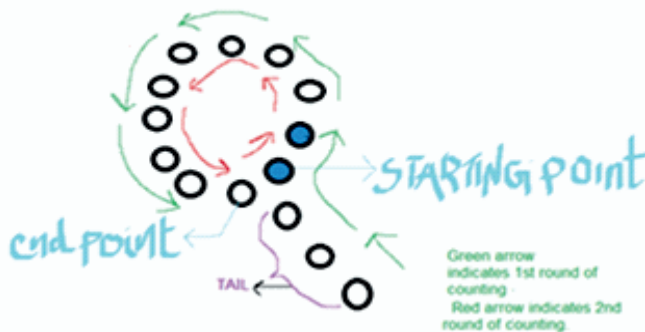
### NUMBER PLAY
